State of Georgia Columbia County: On this 3rd day of January 1856 personally came before me Stephen Drane a Judge of the Inferior Court, a court of record for and in said County and State William Jones administrator of the estate of James Stallings late of this County deceased who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath saith that he has reason to believe, that, the said James Stallings was a Captain in the Georgia or Continental line during the Revolution, and, that, he has no evidence to say, that, the said James Stallings ever received his pay for his services. For those services he refers to the Georgia Records, and, respectfully ask, the settlement of the claim from the Office of Pensions, under Act of June 7th 1832, war, any other act of Congress granting said state, or, commutation, up to the time of the death of James Stallings which will be promptly proven when required. Sworn to and subscribed the day & year above written.
