State of Georgia Union County: On this 28th day of January A.D. 1855, Personally appeared before us Justices of the Inferior Court of the County and State aforesaid, William Prater, for his Wife Nancy Prater and Jacob B Stewart and Polley Stewart and after being duly sworn according to law declare on oath, That they are the Children and Heirs of the said Edward Stuart who was a Soldier of the State of North Carolina and who served in the Company commanded by Captain Peter Houston in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Shelby in the Revolutionary War declared against Great Britain July 4th A.D. 1776, and that he died the 14th day of May A.D. 1832, That there Mother died the 13th day of August 1838, and that they were married the 18th day of August in the year 1782.

They make this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Pension due Edward Stuart above named, and that he has never drawn a pension at any Agency of the United States, Hereby Revoking any and all former Powers of Attorney that may have been given by us in the premises above named, and that We hereby constitute, appoint and authorize irrevocably by these Presents William H. Query and Henry H Walker of Stock Hill Georgia, to represent, to demand and receive from the Officers of the United States, all our rights in any manner of claim for pension or arrears of pension, for us and in our names as legal Heirs of the said Edward Stuart who died leaving the same undrawn, as in right of law, custom or equity we are or may be entitled. In testimony whereof we have on this date first written hereunto set our hands and seals.
