I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." On this Sixteenth day of October in the year of our Lord 1855 personally appeared before the Inferior Court the same being a Court of Record held in and for said County, in Open Court, Mrs. Martha Teal a resident of in the County and State aforesaid aged Seventy One years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Law of the United States passed the 3<sup>rd</sup> of February 1853, granting Pensions to the widows of persons who

That she is the widow of Emanuel Teal who was a Private in Captain Hogan's company in Revolutionary War.

She further declares that she was married to the said Emanuel Teal on the day of 1811: that her said husband died on the Tenth day of January 1833, that she was not married to him prior to the Second day of January 1800, but at the time above stated. That there is no public record of her marriage, nor a private record of her marriage and she further declares that she is now a widow.

[p 10: on September 29, 1856 in Campbell County Georgia, Mary Worthan wrote a letter to the Commissioner of pensions in which she states she is a daughter of Emanuel Teal who went into the service from Pitt County North Carolina and served several years during the Revolutionary War; that her father died in Henry County Georgia in 1830 on the first of January.
