Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." To Honorable William L Marcy Secretary of War

The undersigned is the son of George Tyler, who resided in Caroline County Virginia. During the revolutionary War. My Father served as an officer in the Virginia Regiment during the whole War, and was at the battle of Yorktown at the surrender of Cornwallis [October 19, 1781]. And the undersigned nor any of the heirs of said George Tyler, has ever received any benefit for his Services, only the gratitude of his Country, The undersigned is now 65 years of age and if any pension is due the heirs of said George Tyler my father, I would be glad to know by you what course is necessary to pursue to obtain the same. A reply on the above subject will oblige.
