Pension Application of George Jackson R15396

Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[A typed summary of the record states that the heirs of George Jackson filed a claim for his services as a Captain of Virginia volunteers. In 1856 the application and other papers were sent to the Committee on Revolutionary claims of the House of Representatives and were never returned to the Pension Office.

A letter dated 1909 to the Commissioner of Pensions requests information about the dates of birth and death of George Jackson and John Jackson, as follows: "Col. George Jackson of Clarksburg, Harrison Co. West Virginia received his title in the Revolutionary War. His father John Jackson of Jacksons Fort now Buckhannon, W. Virginia was also in the war of the Revolution."
