Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

[Note: The federal file contains no application or other document that would help to identify this veteran or his service. The Virginia State Library, however, on its website has the following posted regarding a Lieutenant named Walter Scott who may or may not be the individual referred to in the correspondence in the federal file, but I believe it does relate to the same man.]

I certify that Walter Scott served in the State Regiment of Artillery as a Sergeant from the 1st of March in the year 1776 [could be 1778] till the month of July in that year, as a Conductor from the month of July till the month of August in that year and cadet from August till the 8th of December in the same year, and Lieutenant from the said 8th of December till March 1781 when the Regiment was reduced and as a Lieutenant in Captain Roane's Company to which he was among till the 14th of February 1782 at which time he became Supernumerary.
