I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." On the motion of William Tapscott and Raleigh Tapscott who made oath according to law, and entered into and acknowledged a bond with security, Letters of administration of the own administered estate of George Tapscott deceased are granted to the said William and Raleigh Tapscott with the will of the said George Tapscott deceased heretofore admitted to record in this court annexed, in due form.

On the application of William Tapscott the surviving administrator with the will annexed of George Tapscott deceased, the Court doth certify that it appeared to the court by satisfactory evidence adduced that Nancy W Tapscott who intermarried with Robert Evans, Sarah S Tapscott, who intermarried with Isaac Baber, James Tapscott, George Tapscott, Raleigh Tapscott, William Tapscott and Elizabeth Tapscott who intermarried with John N Blankenship are the only children and heirs of the said George Scott deceased, which is ordered to be certified to the Secretary at war — A Copy Test R.
