She fouther declars that to the best of his recolection. West Returned from his Serves in the war about the year seventeen hundred and Eightey or Eightley one. She fouther declars that She was Marrid to the Said Willis West in Sampson County North Carolina in our about October 1789 in Seventeen hundred and Eighty nine and that his said husband died on the twenty third day of November Eighteen hundred and Thirty Sevin in Fayette County Georgia and that she was marred to the said Willis West according to Law at the time above Stated and dates and that she has no minor children She fouther declars that She is Now the Widow of Willis West Deseast Sworn to and Subscribed on the day and year above writen Befoure Me this the 6 day of
