
## Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements & Rosters

Pension Application of Charles Dyer R3176 VA Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

Fort Randolph [at Point Pleasant, now WV] 25th Sep'r. 1778

The Bearer Charles Dyer a Soldier in my Compy of the 12<sup>th</sup> Virg'a. Reg't. whose time of Enlistment is fully Expired is hereby Discharged. Having served upwards of two years and behaved himself During the s'd. time as a good soldier

Given under my hand Wm. McKee [William McKee] Capt. 12<sup>th</sup> Virg'a Reg't



This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia continental Line as settled their Accounts and received Certificates for the balance of their full pay, according to An Act of Assembly, passed the November Session 1781, directing the Auditors of Public Accounts to settle and adjust the pay and accounts of the said Officers and Soldiers from the 1st January 1777 to 31st December 1781, (See Hening's Statutes at Large, Vol. 10, p. 462,) that a settlement was made on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of April 1784 in the name of Charles Dyer as Sol. Inf and evidence of the indebtedness of the State to him for £33.6.8 delivered to Capt. McKee but as the original settlements or copies thereof are not to be found in this Office, the term of service embraced therein cannot be stated

On this 12<sup>th</sup> day of March AD 1855 came before the undersigned county Judge for said County (having jurisdiction of all Probate Matters in said Co Bennit Jacobs and Austin Jacobs who being duly sworn by me depose and say that Charles Dyer who died on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of Sept AD 1830 left the following named children & heirs towit Elisabeth Vaughn (since deceased William Dyer Mary Hubberd (since deceased) John Dyer (since deceased) James Dyer (since deceased) Charles Dyer, Hugh Dyer Nancy Hurst Elizabeth Dyer Jonathan Dyer and Lettis Hackly[?] (since died) and that said Charles Dyer left no widow who is now living and allso that the said Charles Dyer is the identical Charles Dyer whose application for a Pension was made by Jon[?] Jennings and who served in the Revolutionary War as is described in the certificate of discharge presented herewith, as we verily believe
