I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Georgia Washington County: On this first day of July 1833 personally appeared in open court before the Inferior Court of said County Thomas Hardee Resident of the County and State aforesaid aged seventy-eight years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. He entered the service and served as herein after mentioned.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency of any State or Territory, And this deponent further saith that he has no discharge or other documentary evidence of his service, nor is there any living witness known to him by whom he can prove the same, that he did Serve during the revolution not less than 9 months and 15 days as a private Soldier, that he Served in the field with an embodied Corps called into service by competent authority and was not during that time employed in any civil pursuit.

- " 5th " I never served with the regulars 2 militia Regiments
- " 6th " I did which is lost by John Curry
- " 7th " Jared Wood Misail Wood Benjamin Sessions William P Hayns Alexander Irwin & John Harden

[fn p. 7: On July 13, 1853 in Washington County Georgia, Dicey Hardee, 67, filed for a widow's pension under the 1853 act stating that she is the widow of Thomas Hardee who was a pensioner for his service in the revolution; that she married him on the 30th day of June 1822; that her husband died in Washington County Georgia on September 26, 1839 and that she remains his widow.]

[fn p. 9: marriage license dated June 26, 1822, and issued in Washington County Georgia for the marriage of Thomas Hardee to Dicy Eady.]

[facts in file: the widow died in 1853 leaving children but knows names are given in the file. She died some time prior to October 17, 1853.]

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$31.66 per annum commencing March 4th, 1831, for 9 1/2 months service as a private in the North Carolina militia.]
