

and believed; that he lived within 4 miles of said Jolly & his wife Elizabeth Jolly (whose maiden name was Smith); that he knows of his own personal knowledge that Joseph & Elizabeth Jolly lived together as man and wife and that their oldest children were Amy, Roda [Rhoda] & Henry; that he thinks Amy the oldest child was about four years older than this deponent; that this deponent further swears that Nicholas Corry,¹ John Jeffers [sic]² and Moses Guyton³ all served [in the revolution] from this neighborhood (as did Aaron Guyton⁴): affidavit dated May 30, 1855]
