Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." State of Georgia Wilkes County:

On this 22nd day of June 1855 personally appeared before me a Justice of the Inferior Court in & for said County Micajah A. Lane a resident of the County & State aforesaid, who being duly sworn according to law declares that his father James Lane enlisted in Hanover County in the State of Virginia under Captain Abbott and served about five years in the Continental line in the Revolutionary War: He was in the service at Yorktown and present when Cornwallis surrendered [October 19, 1781]. He died on the 10th day of December 1798. He was married to Rachel Anthony on day of January 1789 and his widow the said Rachel died on the 12th day of August 1838. That there are no other children or heirs of the said Micajah [sic, James] and Rachel now living but deponent and his brother Mark A. Lane of Cobb County in said state. That deponent makes this application for the purpose of obtaining the Pension money due to his said mother Rachel Lane in her lifetime under the act of the 7th day of July 1838. He further states that this application is made in behalf of himself and his said brother Mark A Lane. He further states that his said mother Rachel Lane remained a widow from the death of his father until she died and that she did not obtain a Pension nor make application therefor, so far as he knows or believes, and that he has been informed of & believes that the foregoing facts are true. This is to certify, that it appears from a list in this office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line as settled their accounts and received certificates for the balance of their full pay, according to an act of assembly, passed the November session 1781, directing the Auditors of Public Accounts to settle and adjust the pay and accounts of said Officers and Soldiers from the first January 1777 to 31st December 1781, (see Hening's Statutes at Large, vol. 10, p. 462,) that a settlement was made on the 22nd day of March 1783 in the name of James Lane as Sergeant Infantry and evidence of the indebtedness of the State to him was £131.0.11,delivered to Colonel John Gibson but as the original settlements or copies thereof or not to be found in this office, the term of service embraced therein cannot be stated.

Given under my hand at the First Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 16 day of February 1856.
