I knew Mr. Robert Simons when he resided in George Town District, about the year 1790, and for several years after that period -- And I believe from what I heard of him from General Peter Horry who served with General Marion -- and from others that Mr. Simons served in a military capacity during the revolutionary war on the side of America –
