

On this ___ [blank in original] day of April 1833 personally appeared in open court before the court of pleas & Quarter Sessions now sitting for the County of Davidson State of Tennessee Peter Bashaw who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following additional declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th, 1832-- in answer to objections of the war department to his former declaration.

I was born in the year 1763, March 31. I have a record of my [age] at home. I was born in Fauquier County in the State of Virginia, where I lived until the Revolutionary war, & during it, unless whilst I was in service I resided in said County & State. In 1809, I moved from Fauquier County Virginia to Davidson County in the State of Tennessee where I have resided ever since, & still resides--

Whilst in service I was always a private & never was an officer during the Revolutionary War.

I served in my first tour, mentioned in my former declaration four months being called out for three but I served four as a private being a substitute in the place of Joseph Jones.

In my second tour, I served three months being a private & substitute in the place of Herman Utterback, in a company of militia commanded by Captain Jennings.

In my last tour, I served three months as a substitute & private, in place of Josiah Holesclaw, in a company of militia commanded by Captain Helloms.

I refer to the following gentleman in relation to my character, & the service --Edmund Goodrich, William Neely, William Fowlkes, Henry Fowlkes, Matthew P. Walker, Benjamin Morgan, John Maxcy [?], Enoch Cunningham, Honorable John Bell, & Felix Grundy, members of Congress, & Andrew Jackson President of the US.
