Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Alabama Bibb County: SS

On this 17th day of October A.D. 1832 personally appeared before the Circuit Court for the County aforesaid John Smith a resident of said County and State aforesaid, aged seventy-three years, who being duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. That he was placed on the pension roll under the Act of March 18, 1818, and has been dropped or struck therefrom on account of property. That he was a private in the Regiment commanded by Colonel William Thompson [William Thomson] in the line of the State of South Carolina on the Continental establishment. That his place of residence when the first application was made was Edgefield District South Carolina, and is now in Bibb County, Alabama.

[fn p. 3: The following note appears: "The papers of John Smith No. 7274 act 18th of March 1818 – which were in this file have been taken out and filed in their proper place – that John Smith above named being still on the rolls act 18 March 1818 – The papers of the other John Smith of 18 March 1818 whose name has been dropped are the papers that should be (when found) put in this file – certificate issued 27 April 1820."]¹

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$80 per annum commencing March 4th, 1831, for two-year service as a private in the South Carolina Continental line.]
