## Pension Application of Isaac Bates S328 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

State of North Carolina } Pearsonly apeared Befor me John Everein one of the Justices of the peace **Buncombe County** for the County of Buncombe Isaac Bates Who says he is the same Isaac } Bates who was shot By the Cherrokee [sic: Cherokee] Indians In the Right arm in the Cherokee War in the year 1781 or 1782 he was out with a gard after some Cattle Near the Tellico plains he was a private under Colonel Armstrong And Surveir [sic: Col. John Sevier] and shortly aftered Received The Wound in my arm - was Ampitated and Taken off within a few Inch of my shouldier and in Consequence of said wound was Examined by the Commisers appointed by Lawfull authority to Examine & Report on The Nature of his Wound and the Sum which he should be intitled to as a pensioner that he was in consequence of said Examination placed on the pension List of North Carolina and paid by said State up to the 4<sup>th</sup> of September 1808 at the Rate of Three Dollars fifty Cents per month Equal to 42 Dollars pr. year since which period he has been Transfered to Pension List of the United States and paid by the Commisioner of Loan at Ralaigh [sic: Raleigh] Sheriff Haywood up to the 4<sup>th</sup> of September 1814 one year & half at the Rate of five Dollars 20 Cents pr year agreeable To Late Act of Congress of the United States that he has Due to him his pension from the 4<sup>th</sup> of September 1817 to the present Date whatever Goverment allows him as a pension That he now Lives in White County State of Tennessee where he has Resided Three years past previous to which he Lived in Buncombe County North Carolina
