Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

I William Sebre [sic], of Northumberland County, Virginia do hereby declare, that I enlisted in the Continental service in the year 1776 or 1777 under Ensign George Eskridge & marched under the command of Captain Edward Hull [perhaps Edwin Hull] to Valley Forge, where I was joined to the 15th Regiment commanded by Colonel Innis [James Innis] in the Brigade commanded by General Woodford, and served as a Private until the conclusion of the War, when I was honorably discharged by Captain Irish; but from the great length of time which has elapsed since my discharge & considering the instrument containing it of no further value I have lost it — I further declare that from my very reduced circumstances I am justly in need of the assistance of my country for support.
