The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

District of Georgia

On this first day of December in the year of our Lord 1819 before me the subscriber, one of the Justices of the Inferior Court of Chatham County in the said district personally appeared James Tison aged 65 years, resident of Effingham County, in said district who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath take the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" That he the said James Tison, first enlisted in the service of the United States, to the best of his recollection about the year 1775 in the State of North Carolina, in the company commanded by Captain Alderson [Simon Alderson], of the Regiment commanded by Colonel Bunkam [sic, Edward Buncombel, and Lieutenant Col. Irvine, in the line of the State of North Carolina in the Continental establishment that he continued in the said service until the year 1779 or 1780, when he was discharged from service in Halifax, in the State of North Carolina. That at the time of his discharge he was attached to the company of Captain Braddock [sic, probably Capt. John Craddock] who was under the command of Colonel Patton [John Patten]. That he was in the battles of Brandywine [September 11, 1777], German Town [sic, Germantown, October 4, 1777] & Monmouth Court House [June 28, 1778], and that he is in reduced circumstances & stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power, than his on oath, of his said services. That he first enlisted as before sit under Captain Alderson for the term of two years & a half.
