On this 20th day of September 1822 before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Superior Court for the said district personally appeared Charles Wheeler aged fifty nine years resident in the county of Columbian in the said district who being by me duly sworn according to law, Doth on his Oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress Entitled, an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United State in the revolutionary war That he the said Charles Wheeler enlisted for the term of Three years on the 13th day of August in the year 1781 in the state of Maryland in the company commanded by Capt John Mitchell of the regiment commanded by Col. John Stewart in the line of the State of Maryland on the continental Establishment That he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the united states untill the 29th November 1783 when he was discharged from service in the said state and that he was in the battles of the Capture of Cornwallis at Little york in Virginia [siege of Yorktown, 28 Sep - 19 Oct 1781]

and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services
