Pension application of William Wroe S39918 Transcribed by Will Graves

Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

District of Virginia, Northumberland County, to wit:

On the 9th day of March 1819 in open Court held for the County aforesaid, personally appeared William Wroe aged sixty years, resident in the said County, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the Act of Congress entitled "an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war," that he the said William Wroe in the year 1776 enlisted in Captain Burgess Ball's company of infantry in the ___ Regiment commanded by Colonel Josias Parker [Josiah Parker], in the Virginia line upon Continental Establishment, that he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the United States until the year 1778 when he was discharged at Valley Forge in the State of Pennsylvania, and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services except the accompanying return of clothing signed by Colonel W. Russell commanding General Muhlenberg's Brigade dated February 6, 1778.

Sworn to and declared in open Court the day & year aforesaid.

On this 5th April 1824 Personally appeared William Wroe of lawful age being upwards of sixty years, & made oath on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that Absalum Wroe [Absalom Wroe] was in the land and naval service of the United States two years in the Revolutionary War, that they both served as privates together, that they first served under Colonel Josias Parker, 5th Virginia Regiment and as occasion required they served at times in the Navy – and after serving out the term for which they enlisted (two years) they obtained an honorable discharges. Deponent having the one he obtained now in his possession – the said Abraham Wroe having lost his discharge soon after the war.



Northumberland County State of Virginia to Wit

Be it known that before me William Henderson a Justice of the Peace in and for said County personally Appeared Captain Samuel Cralle aged 69 years and made oath in due form of Law that he was well Acquainted with William Wroe an old Revolutionary Soldier of the United States and knows that the said William Wroe enlisted in the Army of the Revolution for three years and further knows that he continued in service for the full term of three years.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 9 day of May 1831 S/Wm Henderson
