Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." This day personally appeared before me Joseph N Campbell one of the Associate Judges in and for the County aforesaid John Thompson a resident Citizen of the United States who deposeth & saith, That on the fifth day of February 1776 he Enlisted in the Army of the United States for two years in Captain [illegible] Mourtens [probably Capt. John Morton's] Company of the fourth Regiment in the Virginia line and that he served out the full term for which he Enlisted and was discharged on the fourth day of February 1778 by General Scott that several years after being discharged this deponent removed to the back part of the State of Virginia and understanding that there was to be some bounty given to those who would produce their discharges he was induced to afford his to his Father Requesting him to Endeavor to procure the bounty for him and by some means this deponent's discharge was miscarried & lost and that he this deponent half not received any Bounty old Pension from Government other than his monthly pay while in service. And in Consequence of his age and Infirmity is Reduced to a Situation that he stands in need of Assistance from his Country.
