At a Monthly Sessions Court held for Goochland County at the Courthouse on Monday the 20^{th} day of July 1818

Present in Court, John Underwood, Nicholas M. Vaughan, Thomas Curd & Andrew Kean Gentlemen Justices

On this 20th day of July 1818 personally appeared in court George Tyler aged sixty one years resident in the County of Goochland & state of Virginia, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war", that he the said George Tyler enlisted in the county of Goochland in the State of Virginia in the company commanded by Capt. Scott in the regiment of Colo. Davis [sic: William Davies] in the year 1780 or 1781 for 18 months that he continued to serve in the said corps or in the service of the United States for the term of his enlistment after which he was regularly discharged from service at Albemarle old Ct house in the County of Albemarle & State aforesaid that he was not in any Battles while in service & that he is in reduced circumstances & stands in need of assistance from his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services except the affidavit of Wm Hix [William Hicks; pension application S7016] which is here filed sworn to & declared before the county court of Goochland which is a Court of Record, the day and year aforesaid and it is ordered by the Court aforesaid to be certified that it appears to its satisfaction that the said George Tyler did serve in the revolutionary war as stated in the preceeding declaration against the common enemy for the term of 9 months on the continental establishment & doth now transmit the proceedings had before & with the affidavit of said Hix to the secretary for the department of war pursuant to the directions of the aforementioned act of congress.

State of Virginia

At a Quarterly Sessions Court held for Goochland County at the Courthouse on Monday the $21^{\rm st}$ day of Aug't. 1820

Present in court, George W. Payne, William Bolling, William Ford & William Guerant Gentlemen Justices

On this 21st day of Aug't 1820 personally appeared in open Court being a Court of record for the said County of Goochland George Tyler aged about 63 years resident in said County of Goochland who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare that he enlisted in the County of Goochland in the State of Virginia in the Company commanded by Capt Scott in the regiment of Colo. Davis in the year 1780 or 1781 for 18 months on continental establishment, that he continued in the service of the United States for the term of his enlistment, that he was regularly discharged form service in the County of Albemarle at Albemarle old courthouse in the state aforesaid, as he before stated before this court on the 20th day of July 1818 and that he in consequence of the declaration & statement aforesaid made received a certificate for a pension dated 13th March 1819 & marked 7605 and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th day of March 1818. And that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me over and above debts due from me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed & by me subscribed. my occupation or trade is that of a farmer on rented land, my family is my wife, Nancy Cooper as stated at

the foot of my schedule. sworn to before the court aforesaid on the said 21st Aug't 1820 (A Schedule towit) A list of property owned by George Tyler of the County of Goochland & State of Virginia the 21st day of August 1820.
