Nathaniel Waller of New Hanover County, North Carolina being duly sworn maketh oath that in the year 1782 he entered the Service of the United States in the Continental line of North Carolina in the North Carolina Regiment, and Benjamin Carter's Company -- that he served until he was regularly discharged after the peace in 1783 -- and further swears he is poor and in need of the aid of his Country --

I Henry Potter, District Judge of the US for the District aforesaid, do hereby certify that, from the foregoing declaration & the accompanying testimony, it appears to my satisfaction, that the said Nathaniel Waller did serve in the revolutionary war, against the common enemy, for the term of 9 months or until the end of the war, on the Continental establishment; and that he is poor & needs the aid of his country; and I now transmit the proceedings & testimony put into my hands for that purpose (judge Baker being dead) to the Secretary for the War Department. 1st January 1819 S/ H. On this 13th day of August 1821. Personally appeared in open Court, being a Court of Record for the County aforesaid, Nathaniel Waller aged fifty-seven years, resident in the County & District above mentioned, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows. That he entered into the land service 1st of June 1782 in the 3rd Regiment of North Carolina Continental Troops commanded by Colonel Archibald Lytle & Captain "Captain" Benjamin Carter's company of said Regiment, and served to the end of the war. That his original declaration was made sometime in the month of October 1818. The Number of the Pension Certificate is 8839. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner whatever disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed
