Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

## North Carolina – SS that

On this 22nd day of July A.D. 1818 before may the subscriber one of the Judges of the Superior Courts of Law & Equity of the said State, personally appeared John Wheeley aged sixty-six years resident in Orange County in said State who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolution" – That he the said John enlisted in King & Queen County in Virginia, in the year 1777 in the Company commanded by Captain Henry Dudley of the 2nd Virginia Regiment on the Continental establishment commanded by Lieutenant Colonel \_\_day of May – that he enlisted for three years – that he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the United States until first day of May 1780, when he was discharged from service in Williamsburg in Virginia by Lieutenant Colonel \_\_ Brent. That he was in the battle of Stoney Point besides skirmishes; & that he is in reduced circumstances & needs the Assistance of his Country for support; & that he hath no other evidence now in his power of his said services than that hereto annexed – Sworn to & declared before me the day & year aforesaid at Orange County

[Clayton Jones and Philip Birch of Orange County North Carolina gave a supporting affidavit in which they said they knew the veteran while living in King & Queen County Virginia and knew of his enlistment in the Continental Army but did not themselves enlist in the Army; that they are now residents of Orange County North Carolina and believe the veteran to be in need of the assistance of his country for support.]

[fn p. 8: is a power of attorney granted by the veteran to James S. Smith of Orange County, NC to pursue his claim for a pension. This document bears the following signature:

On this first day of September 1820 personally appeared in open Court (this being the Court of record for Orange County) John Wheely aged 68 years, resident in Orange County, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the War of the Revolution as follows. That he served in the 2nd Virginia State Regiment commanded by Colonel grant in the company commanded by Captain Henry Dudley, that he served for the term of 3 years & was in the Battle at Stony Point, and was discharged at Williamsburg – That he was placed on the pension roll of the United States under the act of 1818 on the 25th day of January 1819 & that the number of his original Certificate is 5678 –

He is aged 68 and infirm. His wife is aged 71, she cannot walk and is unable to help herself. He has a boy about 8 years old in his family. This composes all his family. He is a farmer by occupation.
