[No application was in the file. The following is a summary on a printed form.] NAME Smith, William Va. Soldier states that he served in Captain John Webb's Co., Col. Alexander McClannahan's regt. in

the service of the United States.

The list of invalid pensioners of Lincoln Co., Tenn., printed in 1835, shows William Smith pensioned from Jany. 1, 1803 under the Acts Military establishment.

NOTES:

Capt. John Webb's company was raised in Essex or Middlesex County in 1776 in the 7th Virginia Regiment of Foot. Alexander McLanachan, also spelled McClenachan, was a Colonel in the regiment.

On 12 June 1823 William Smith applied to transfer his pension from Cumberland County NC to Lincoln County TN.
