This day David King personally appeared before me Peter R. Davis one of the acting Justices of the peace for said County and made oath that he is the identical person mention in the certificate of J. C. Calhoun Secretary of War, of which certificate the following is a copy

Revolutionary Claim

I certify that in conformity with the law of the United States of the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818 David King late a private in the army of the revolution is inscribed on the pension List Roll of the North Carolina Agency at the rate of eight dollars per month to commence on the twenty third day of August one thousand eight hundred and nineteen

Given at the War office of the United States this twenty ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred and nineteen. Signed J. C. Calhoun Secretary of War

And the said David King maketh oath also that he has been struck from the pension list on account of property [under the act of 1 May 1820], that he was a soldier of the revolution and served in the third regiment as he believes of North Carolina under the command of General Jethro Sumner & in Capt Edward Yarboroughs Company, that at the time he was placed on the pension list he resided in Warren County in the State of North Carolina and that he still resides there

NOTE: David King does not appear to have received a pension under the act of 7 June 1832 as a result of the above application. On 26 Nov 1832, however, he was success with <u>pension application W20347</u>. That file includes his 1819 application referred to above.
