Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

## State of Virginia, Chesterfield County, to wit

On this 8th day of October A.D. 1832, personally appeared before the County Court of Chesterfield County Francis Royall a resident of the County and state aforesaid, aged seventy-four years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832 entitled "An act supplementary to the act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the revolution."

That he the said Francis Royall, on the 15th day of August A.D. 1777, enlisted in the Army of the United States as a private in the company commanded by Captain Robert Dandridge attached to Colonel Marshall's [Thomas Marshall] Regiment of Artillery, being the 2nd Virginia Regiment, and continued to serve in the said Regiment during the period of three years and a few days, when he was discharged, and received a written discharge, he thinks from Captain William Spiller, but not supposing the discharge would be of any value, it has been either lost or destroyed; That during the term of his military services he was in no battle; that he resided in Chesterfield County when he enlisted; that a portion of the time of his military service he was stationed at Hampton, Portsmouth and Little York in Virginia, and a part of the time he was in North and South Carolina. He exhibited a due bill for clothing, which is hereto annexed, – That he was born in Chesterfield County, on the 11th day of October in the year 1758, as appears by a register of his birth now in his possession; that he has resided in Chesterfield County ever since the revolutionary war.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state: Sworn to and subscribed the day & year aforesaid
