State of North Carolina Davidson County: SS

On this 14 day of __personally appeared in open Court before the Justices of said the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions for the County aforesaid now sitting John White resident of Davidson County and State of North Carolina & aged sixty-seven years who being first sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated -- that he entered the service a drafted militia man in the County of New Hanover and State of North Carolina -- where he at that time resided, in the Feb. of the year before peace was made in the Infantry. That the company to which he was attached was commanded by George McCulloch -- Thomas Russ acted as Lieutenant = one Felix [?] [indecipherable word] of Colonel Thomas [illegible last name], Stephen Andress [?] Major [illegible interlined words] Regiment and Genl. Lenningtons [sic, Lillington's] brigade -- that he marched from New Hanover County to South Carolina with some other militia from the State of North Carolina from New Bern District -- That he recollects Major Dunn who was one of the officers in command [?] that on his return he was engaged with his Company in a skirmish near Wilmington, County and State aforesaid, that he served a tour of six months and was honorably discharged, that he has no documentary evidence and that he knows of no person whose testimony he can procure to testify to his service -- he further states that previous to his being drafted as aforesaid he had volunteered in Light Horse Company commanded or to be commanded by Charles [indecipherable last name] but before being equipped was drafted as aforesaid.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State.

Sworn to & subscribed in Open Court 14th of August 1832. S/ John White S/ D. Mock, CCC

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$20 per annum commencing March 4th, 1831 for 6 months service in the North Carolina militia as a private.]
