Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]



July 17th, 1784 I have this Day Received from General Richard Winn the full value of my Account against the Public now lying in the Auditor's Office for auditing and afterwards to get an indent for the same from the Treasury and I do Request the Commissioners of the Treasury of the State of South Carolina to make out the Indent for the same with the Interest pursuant to the Resolve of the Legislative [sic] in that in that case to him the said Richard Winn and to accept this as a Receipt in full against the public for the said Account.
