I have this Day received from Major Parsons the full value of £28.11.5 of my Account against the Public Now Lying in the Auditor's office for Auditing and afterwards to get an Indent for the same from the Treasury and I request the Commissioners of the treasury of the State of South Carolina to make out the Indent for the same with the Interest pursuant to the Resolve of the Legislature in that Case to him the said Major Parsons and to accept this as a Receipt in full against the public for said Accounts.
