I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of South Carolina Ninety Six District} Personally appeared Barbara Criser wadow [widow], and Declared on her oath being duly Sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Deposeth & saith, that on or about the 4th day of May last, She had a certain Bay horse taken her Property, by one Gibson, supposing John Gibson, the said Gibson belonging to Colonel John Winn's Regiment – Supposing the said Horse was Entered in the Publick Service of the Last Expedition to East Floraday [Florida], under the Command of Colonel Winn & Colonel Beard [Jonas Beard]. The said Horse was brought home & was returned the 2nd day of October Last, being Gone in all, from her service, one Hundred & fifty Days, for which Service she never received any Part of Payment, as yet & further Saith not
