Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

The Petition of Caleb Davis of Chester District praying compensation for Losses sustained in the revolutionary war

[p 11: The petition has filed with the South Carolina House of Representatives. The version filed with the Senate of South Carolina as transcribed below is identical except for technical references to the one filed in the House and is much more legible.]

To the Honorable the President and Members of the Senate of the State of South Carolina The petition of your petitioner humbly Sheweth

That your petitioner in the year 1780, while in the service of his country with Major Pearson² lost a horse which he verily believes to have been worth one hundred dollars which horse was taken and carried away by a party of men who passed themselves under the denomination of friends to the American cause. That in the year 1781, while your petitioner was doing duty in behalf of this country with Lieutenant James Thomas³ in the neighborhood of Birely's ferry [probably Brierly's Ferry] on Broad River, some of General Greene's [Nathanael Greene's] Army called at the house of your petitioner and turned three horses into his field of oats which he thinks would have made forty bushels and destroyed them in such a manner that he lost the whole of them. That the said men at the same time took from your petitioner twenty-five bushels of clean wheat which they said was for the use of General Greene's Army. They also at the same time and place took and carried away from your petitioner a horse which he verily believes to have been worth eighty dollars. Your petitioner further states that he has never had any return of

any of the above mentioned property nor any compensation therefore by certificate Indent or in any other way whatsoever. Your petitioner therefore prays your Honorable body to take the above into consideration and grant him that compensation to which he is justly entitled and your petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray
