Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later intereenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

This day personally appeared Before Me Jasper Humbora a Soldier in Colonel Hill's Regiment and Made Oath as the Law Directs that by his Service In the State troops of South Carolina Commanded by General Sumter [Thomas Sumter] and I the said Jasper Humber is Entitled to one Negro according to the terms of the Enlistment [text obliterated and rendered illegible] and that He the said Jasper Humber did not Violate the Said [text obliterated and rendered illegible] Set [?] nor dispose of the said Negro to any person But the Archibald McCurdy Who has purchased the same from Me & his Receipt Will Be to the public another Receipt from me. 
