I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." That payroll indicates that this veteran received the slave promised him as part of "Sumter's Wages" paid to men who served in the South Carolina ten months State Troops.
