The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8^{th} of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Know all men by these presents that I John Griffin of the State of South Carolina have Bargained and Sold my [text too faint to discern] for a Negro, for my Service of ten months in the [text too faint to discern] Regiment of the State Troops Commanded by Lieut. Col. Charles Middleton [Charles S Myddelton] unto James Sharp Quarter Master of said Regiment for the Horse that the said Sharp Did Ride in the [text too faint to discern] of his own property Branded thus B on the Near shoulder and Buttock Seven years old Near fourteen hands High, four Likely Cows and Calves none of the cows to exceed Eight years old the cows to be Delivered the first of May At the Dwelling house of said Sharp, And if any [text too faint to discern] would happen to said Griffin that the Negro [text too faint to discern] that then the Bargain shall be Void and of no Effect


