Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the Honorable the President & other Members of the Senate of South Carolina

The humble petition of Edward Andrews a Citizen of Fairfield District Sheweth unto your Honorable Body – that your petitioner, in obedience to the call of duty, & the requisitions of the Law, entered the Service of this State as a private Soldier in a regiment of Militia commanded by Colonel Thomas Taylor, & that he performed Certain duties in that station during the late Revolutionary War. – As will appear to the Satisfaction of your Honorable house by the accompanying Certificates, & chas never received any Compensation therefore, Your Petitioner conceives it unnecessary to bring to the Consideration of your Honorable Body the Justice & equity of a demand on the part of an individual for Labor & Services rendered the Community & the obligations which bind that Community to reward the exertions of its Citizens; in Compliance with express Stipulation. Your petitioner therefore prays that Your Honorable House will take his Case into Consideration & Grant him such Compensation for his Services as you may find due him on examination of the premises & as in duty bound he will in your wisdom ever trust.
