Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

South Carolina York District To the Honorable the President and members of the Senate – The petition of Nancy Dennis Sheweth

That she is the widow and relic of Sumril Dennis Sr. who was one of the soldiers of the revolution and as such was engaged in fighting the battles of his country – That the said Sumril Dennis died very poor and has left your petitioner with but a small pittance not sufficient to provide her with the necessities of life – for proof of which your petitioner begs leave to refer your Honorable body to the annexed affidavits –

Your petitioner therefore prays that she may be placed on the pension list and your petitioner will ever pray &c
