Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.1

[Transcriber's Note: With a name as generic as John Jones, it will be impossible to distinguish which of the transcriptions made from the South Carolina Audited accounts relate to any particular man by that name. I am sure that I have failed to include in the series of transcriptions any multiple claims made by any particular man with that surname.]

## Congarees April 27, 1782

Know all men by these presents that I John Jones of Berkley [Berkeley] County South Carolina have Bargained & Sold and do by these presents Bargain and sell my Bounty Negro that I was to get for serving in the State Troops unto Joseph Culpeper and I the said John Jones do acknowledge that I have received of Joseph Culpeper full value for the said Negro as witness my hand this 27<sup>th</sup> of April 1782
