Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

The petition of Elizabeth Doby humbly Sheweth

That she is the Relic of John Doby<sup>2</sup> deceased who was killed in defense of his Country in the late American war, and that your petitioner is entitled to an annuity from the State under a resolve of this house making provision for the widows of those men who died in the service of their Country during the late war, and that a part of the said annuities have been paid to your petitioner and the Treasurer have refused to make some payments that are now due to your petitioner.

Therefore your petitioner prays that her case may be taken into consideration, and have such relief granted her as to your Honorable house may seem proper.

And your petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray
