Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

To the Honorable the Legislature of the State of South Carolina The Petition of Mary Files

Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner having lost her husband in the late War with Great Britain and having received the annuity allowed by law to Widows left under distressing circumstances, for some time, which will appear by referring to the treasurers books, but as your petitioner is informed that the Treasurer is precluded by a late Law, on Resolution of the Legislature, from paying such annuity as since have become due, without 1st obtaining the order of your Honorable House. Therefore your Petitioner humbly prays that your honors will grant the annuity which is now due to your petitioner, who as in duty bound will pray.
