I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

To the Honorable John Lloyd Esquire – President & the rest of the Members of the Honorable Senate

The Petition of Thomas Finley Mariner Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner was in the Service of the State of Georgia as a Captain. He was then taken Prisoner in the month of January 1779 – that during his Confinement of board the Prison Ship – three Coils of Rope weighing 500 pounds was taken for the Use of the *Congress* Galley – then laying at Purisburgh the property of your Petitioner as per vouchers from Captain Jacob Milligan & Charles Cotesworth Pinckney Esquire Colonel Commandant –

Your Petitioner therefore prays the Honorable Senate to allow him the amount of His Account for said three Coils of Rope & He as in duty Bound shall ever pray Charleston South Carolina

October 10th 1788
