I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcripts "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

The Humble Petition of John Folley [sic]<sup>2</sup>

Sheweth/

That your Petitioner has been a True friend to his Country and served Faithfully in the Continental Army in Colonel Lyttle's [Archibald Lytle's] Regiment [of North Carolina Continentals], and is now so Old and Infirm that he is not Able to Earn his Bread but is even reduced to the Distressed Situation of Begging –

Your Petitioner has applied to the Court of Fairfield for assistance, as also the Commissioners of the Poor but Neither of them Will give him the Least Assistance.

Your petitioner Therefore Humbly Begs your Honors to take his Case into Consideration and to Afford An Old Soldier such relief as will Enable him to live the Few Remaining days he has to live in a Manner, Just above Want and as in Duty Bound he will ever Pray for your Honors Welfare
