I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

That they have duly Considered the same & are of Opinion that having had their Names returned on Colonel Horry's [Peter Horry's] Pay Bill is sufficient Evidence of their Claim & that if they have not already received Indents either themselves or their Attorneys such Indents must now be in the Office of the Commissioner [undeciphered word]⁷ the public Accounts & that they are Entitled to them, but Your Committee think it probable that they have already been paid but have it not in their Power to ascertain it, the [p 2 out of sequence] Papers of that Office being in Charleston & the Committee are of that Opinion from Observing that all the Signatures are in one hand Writing & they do not set forth that they have not already been paid.
