[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]





The Auditor General having made a Remark on my Account for acting as Adjutant General to the Western Division of Militia from 1st February to 4th May 1779 –

I beg leave to observe to you that on my Account for pay as Lt. Col. there is a Credit of £500 Currency in April 1779 – when money was greatly depreciated – I was constantly that year in the field from the month of January until after the Enemy Retreated from Stono [June 20, 1779] – the time charged for acting as Adjutant General is from the collecting of the Militia to oppose the British in Augusta until the 4th May when I joined General Lincoln [Benjamin Lincoln] during which time the appointment not only occasioned me a very extraordinary degree of fatigue but a great expense in keeping Horses to do that duty –
