I Richard Winn of Winsborough [sic] Esquire, do hereby assign the full amount of Principal and Interest, now due & to grow due on the Within certificate (& which I have purchased of the Within named James Hart, as appears by his order² now lying in the office of the Commissioners of the Treasury) unto William Lennox, of Charleston, Merchant, his executors, administrators & assigns, full value received of the said William Lennox this 25th day of July 1785.
