Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Deliver to John Martin Esquire all my Claims for Services done as a foot Soldier in the South Carolina Brigade after the fall of Charleston [Charleston South Carolina fell to the British on May 12, 1780], under the Continental establishment – and this my order shall be your Sufficient Receipt from your humble Servant
