Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I Richard Winn of Winnsborough Esquire do hereby assign the full Amount of Principal & Interest now due and to grow due on the Within Certificate and which I have purchased of the within named George Beasly [sic] as appears by his order now lying in the Office of the Commissioners of the Treasury unto Messrs. Lawson Price & Co. of Charleston Merchants their Executors, Administrators & Assigns for value received from the said Lawson Price & Co. this 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 1785
