[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

Camps<sup>2</sup> under the command of Colonel Neel [Thomas Neel] on the heads of Savana [Savannah] afterwards in the forks of the Saluda under Colonel Winn – he was at Charleston when that City was besieged by the enemy under General Provo [sic, Augustine Prevost] – he afterwards Joined General Sumpter [Thomas Sumter] at Clem's branch was at the Battle of hanging rock<sup>3</sup> and at Sumter's defeat<sup>4</sup> – he afterwards Joined General Green [Nathanael Greene] in Chester District – went to Orangeburg where he Joined General Sumpter – was at Binghams Church [sic, Biggin Church] when he was dismissed –

Your petitioner is now in his eighty-fourth year – very poor and unable to support himself and aged wife with two children who are not possessed of sound mind and as your honorable body has been generous to those who have served their country in the struggle for independence and who are placed in the same situation, your petitioner is induced to make this application for relief –

Your petitioner therefore pray that he may be placed on the pension list and your petitioner will ever pray.
