Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]



I do Certify that Thomas Nichols the Bearer here of was a Soldier in the 6th Regiment of South Carolina in the Revolutionary war, and as well as I can Remember was taken a Prisoner of war at the fall of Charleston [Charleston South Carolina fell to the British on May 12, 1780] and is the same man that Mr. John Bird Petitioned the last legislature in behalf of

Know all Men by these Presents that Tho^s Nichels [sic] Late a Soldier in the Sixth Regt. Of Continentil Troops in the State of So. Carolina & was transfer'd to the first & made a prisoner in the Garasin [garrison] at Charleston on the 12th of May Eighty [1780] – I Do Make Constitute & appoint Jn^o Bird [John Bird] My true & Lawful atturney who petioned [petitioned] the Lezeslature [Legislature] of So. Carolina in My behalf in My Name & Stead to ask Demand & receive from the proper officers of the State of South Carolina or the united States all My pay or the arrars [arrears] of pay that I am intitled to for My Services Dureing the Last war – & I Do further Grant to My Sd atturney to Make up of My [undeciphered word]² any Lawful Manner to Recover the same – in Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal this 9th Day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred & twelve Samuel Young JP S/ Thos Nichels, T his mark
