Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

1782 10th January rec'd of Colonel Wm Massey out of the Military [text obliterated] the Sum of One Hundred & Eighty Dollars for three Months pay as Muster Master General of the State of South Carolina. The Continental pay was Sixty Dollars per month – & that allowed by the State was Five Pounds per Day – the deficiency is charged to the State.



Williamson['s] troops which said Whiskey he did know to be the property of William Massey. Sworn to this 7th day of April 1784
